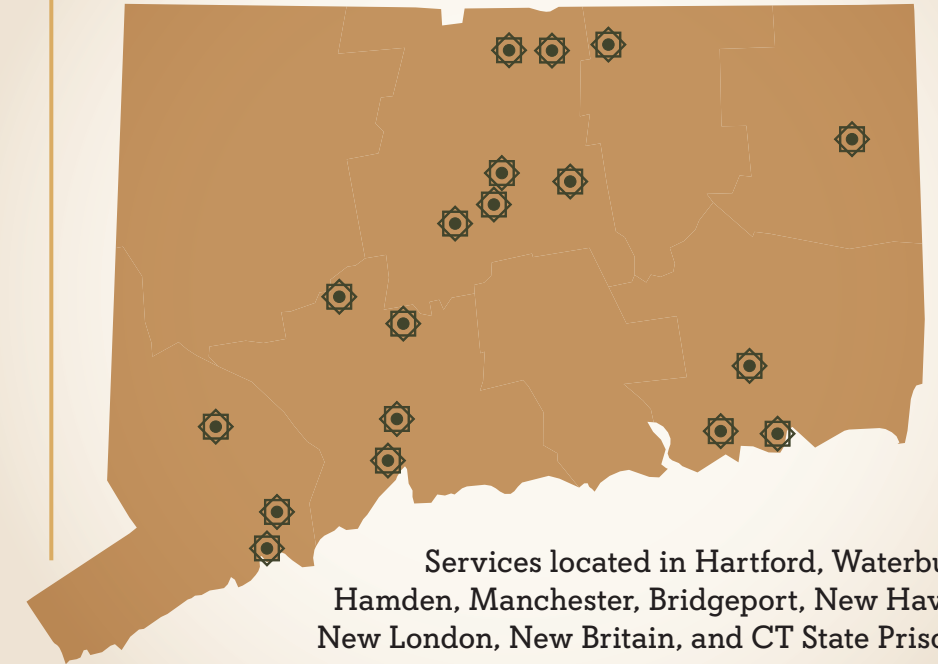

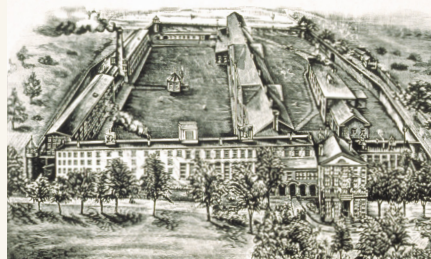

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

1875-2025

Over time, CPA has adapted to changes in Connecticut's criminal justice system by harnessing the collective expertise of its staff, participants, volunteers, board members, and supporters. This collaboration has driven successful, action-based programs with measurable results.

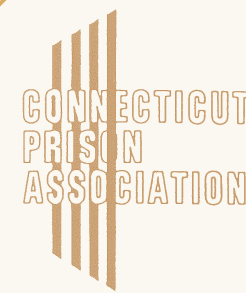


In 1875, The Connecticut State Prison was situated in Wethersfield, just south of Hartford, and its warden supported the Connecticut Prison Association. [Credit: Connecticut Historical Society]

1875: Originally called the Prisoner's Friends' Society of Connecticut, the name changed to Connecticut Prison Association (CPA) in 1876; CPA was founded to aid prisoners after they left jail.

1997: CPA changed its name to Community Partners in Action to reflect the broadening goals of the agency while still retaining the initials "CPA." Several factors compelled the search for a new name, especially the removal of "prison" since it acquired more negative than positive associations.



1999: CPA played a crucial role in creating community-based programs for youth in the juvenile justice system and opened its first program providing supportive counseling, medical and psychiatric services, recreation and family interventions.

1968: After years of advocating to preserve the dignity and humanity of people incarcerated, CPA was a major endorser for creating a state Department of Correction to alleviate prison overcrowding and the physical deterioration of prison facilities. CPA was appointed by Governor John Dempsey to lead the search committee for the Department's first Commissioner.

1981: CPA partnered with the CT Judicial Branch to launch the first community-based Pre-Trial Diversion Program as an alternative to incarceration, which later led to alternative incarceration centers (AIC) throughout the State of CT, the first being CPA's Hartford AIC in 1986, which we still operate today.

2025: CPA celebrates 150 years of "Inspiring Hope." Over the next decade, CPA will focus on breaking down housing barriers, expanding career training, enhancing addiction treatment, and supporting prevention, diversion, and reentry services for adults and youth in Connecticut's criminal justice system.
